 - BSLW (Rachel)
Backstage Library Works provides 2 services: quarterly authority notification and periodic batch processing. The schedule for these services has now been set up.

 - Deduplication (Rachel)
Over 8,000 records have been deduplicated after Vernon's migration to CCS.

 - Polaris upgrade update (Rachel)

Polaris 8.0 will be available by the end of the year. Learn more about the new functions at <https://portal.productboard.com/iii/6-innovative-product-status-board-new/tabs/23-polaris> .

- Bibliocore (Molly)
New discovery layer will launch in 2026.
- OrangeBoy (Molly)
OrangeBoy is a cloud-based tool that consolidates data source information (Polaris, eContent, gate counts, etc) into one platform in order to provide data analysis support for making actionable insights.

Project timeline: CCS staff will begin scheduling training sessions for CCS member libraries in January of 2026 with the anticipated training taking place in February.

Question: What are some examples of how libraries will use OrangeBoy?

Answer: WebReports will still be still available and libraries will still collect gate counts and other data. OrangeBoy is a platform for looking at all of those data points in one spot.

Question: Are databases part of this?

Answer: It will include Overdrive, Cloud Library Mango, Hoopla, Freegal, Kanopy, potentially Beanstack.

Question: What is CCS's overarching goal with OrangeBoy? What is in scope of Orangeboy and what is outside of scope?

Answer: Anything that can be put there will be, but we have to speak with vendors about what is possible.

Question: Will you be able to tell which patrons are only using e-resources and not coming in?

Answer: Possibly, but Overdrive is integrated into ILS so maybe not. Molly will take that question to OrangeBoy and advocate for that.

6. SCRAP Report (Rachel – 5 min.)

- Cataloger's Wiki pages will be drafted for Yoto players, Toni Boxes, and Story Dream Machines.

- The members discussed changing the requirement for the duration in the 300 field. SCRAP decided it didn't need to change since the language does not require adding the data if it isn't present on the item. This is clear on the bibliographic input standards page.
- Action item: Vote on a recommendation from SCRAP to CAMM (15 min.)
- Potential motion: Allow the option to add the video game format, as it appears in the 753 tag, to be included in the 099 tag. This will not be required. 099 is given precedence over 092 in MARC. Benefit is that the video game format displays when browsing search results in Leap and Polaris. Question: Will this affect how records display in PAC? Answer: No

Question: Will this interfere with how 099 is used for Preliminary data

Answer: This recommendation is only for Final records; will not interfere

Clarification: In Prelim records, the format is included in the title field by acquisition staff

N. Mastny (Prospect Heights) moved to allow use of 099 for video game format in final records.

K. Nevins (Zion-Benton) seconded.

- Deduplicating in Leap (Molly – 10 min.)
Frequent question from public services staff: I can't locate item so I created an item record on the fly. Now I want to delete it and keep the correct record.

Review procedures for identifying duplicate records and merging them at <https://www.ccslib.org/training/merging-duplicate-bibliographic-records-leap>

Tip: Check the barcode before creating an on the fly record. There may be an extra digit and that's why the correct record isn't showing up.

Tip: Check the 245, 250, 264, and 300 fields to help you determine whether a record is truly a duplicate

Tip: If merging a single volume record and multi volume, include volume information in the item record before merging

Question: Does this process move holds over to the new record?

Answer: Yes

- New AI enrichment macro for Connexion (Rachel – 10 min.)
This tool provides suggestions for LC call number, Dewey call number, and subject headings.

This is not a definitive source for your subject headings, call numbers. You must still do research and verify, but it may give you a jumping off point if you are stuck. In this example it is suggesting graphic novels, black girls, and travelers, none of which are appropriate for this work. Will not work for genre headings. If you select the suggestion for “Graphic novels,” it will appear as a 650 _0.
